

Stanley Yeldell New Researcher Excellence Award



The Stanley Yeldell New Researcher Excellence Award recognizes a Faculty Member / Post Doctoral Fellow/Scholar who is relatively new to the field, made notable contributions and show future potential to contribute to the fields of Criminology/Criminal Justice and Victimology. While prior research and/or teaching accomplishments are important, the Awards Committee will especially consider the quality of his/her paper submission. The Award will be given to the researcher during the Valedictory Session of the Fourth International Conference of the South Asian Society of Criminology and Victimology (SASCV), to be held during 30-31, January, 2020 at Ahmedabad, Gujarat, India. The award consists of a Plaque, a Certificate and Rupees Ten Thousand Cash Prize.

Rules and Regulations:

- 1. The award will be presented to Faculty members and Post Doctoral Researchers under the age of 40.
- 2. Selections for this award will be on the basis of quality of the abstracts submitted by the researcher and his/her previous outstanding contributions to the field.
- 3. All papers submitted by a student on the themes of the conference, empirical/theoretical/conceptual/critical reviews will be considered. Only single authored abstracts will be considered for the award.
- 4. Weightage will be given to 20% Curriculum Vitae, 30% abstract submission, and 50% extended abstract submission.
- 5. The Awards Committee will only consider the quality of the content of the abstracts/paper and the researchers' previous contribution to the field. The Awards committee will not examine the Presentation skills. The Awardee will be invited to make a presentation of his/her work in the Award Presentation Ceremony.
- 6. It is open to all nationalities (an International Award).

About Prof. Stanley Yeldell

Prof. Stanley B. Yeldell has been a faculty member of the Law/Justice Department, Rowan University, USA for the past 44 Years. He was doing research with the New Jersey Administrative Office of the Courts during the late 1970s. Forty four years later, Yeldell is still mentoring future police officers, lawyers and judges at Rowan University. He was inducted into the college's Law & Justice Hall of Fame.
